GOALS OF THE INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR

The **X International Veterinary Acupuncture Seminar** features an extensive program which groups together some of the major topics in Traditional Chinese Veterinary Medicine (TCVM).



Several presentations deal with clinical treatment of the lung and liver, topics that are frequently encountered in daily practice, and with the clinical use of *Qi Mai*. This first group of presentations is thus intended to express the more traditional side of Veterinary Acupuncture.


In 2006, the major veterinary acupuncture societies of France, Italy and Spain joined in establishing an international circuit, the **Veterinary Acupuncturists of the Mediterranean (VAM)**, which organizes an annual meeting to promote cultural and scientific exchanges between TCVM specialists from the three countries. This year's meeting, the fourth in the series, has been incorporated in the main **SIAV** event and dedicated to *veterinary neurology*. In recent years, in fact, veterinary neurology has achieved the status of a specialized discipline with a systematic approach that starts by carefully analyzing the symptomatology and identifying injuries in order to develop targeted treatments for small animals such as dogs and cats, as well as exotic animals, farm animals and horses. Veterinary Acupuncture has a significant role in the diagnosis and treatment of various neurological pathologies. Many scientific studies and a large body of clinical evidence have demonstrated the mechanisms by which VA's effects are achieved, and how VA makes it possible to affect the body's deep functions and correct the unbalance that lies at the root of the neurological pathology.

The **X International Seminar** will conclude with two wet labs, one for Small Animal Acupuncturists and one for Hippiatric Acupuncturists. In each wet lab, specialists will meet with colleagues from their own field to discuss and deal with several clinical cases using the methods envisaged by TCVM.

The **X International Veterinary Acupuncture Seminar** addresses all of these issues, and will provide an opportunity for veterinary physicians to meet and exchange views: combining a variety of medical disciplines provides a broader range of diagnostic and therapeutic approaches, enhancing medical treatment in the spirit of scientific pluralism and respect for the veterinarian's freedom of choice.
